BioDistrict New Orleans

Strategic Economic and Community Development Priority

- Aligns with City's place-based economic development strategies and the forthcoming Plan for Generational Economic Transformation
- Aligns with national best practices among peer and aspirational cities for creating life sciences and technology-based innovation districts
 - Birmingham and St. Louis
 - Texas Medical Center and Research Triangle
- BioDistrict just awarded a \$500K Build Back Better Regional Challenge grant from EDA; Phase II applications are due March 15th

CEA and Stakeholder Engagement

- Funding: Leverages a portion of the *growth* of sales tax revenue in the District, matched by the State.
- Budget: Requires presentation to Council during City budget presentations, as well as Council approval, before any funds are transferred and spent.
- Master Plan: Requires BioDistrict to create a Master Plan for the district within 12 months of approval of the CEA, and updated a minimum of every five years.
 - Must be submitted for review and approval by the Council and the City Planning Commission, or funding can be withheld.
 - Ensures alignment with policy goals, accountability, and transparency.
 - Must comply with zoning, land use, and historic district, and neighborhood participation requirements.
- Authority of the City: Affirms that nothing shall override the authority of the City within the District.
- Expropriation: The District may not undertake expropriation as a means to acquire land.
- Land Use and Entitlement: The District must follow all applicable ordinances of the City that govern zoning, land use, and historic district requirements.
- Subdistricts: The District can only create subdistricts with prior approval by motion of the City Council.
- Governance: The City and Orleans-affiliated institutions control 10 out of 15 seats.
